## ANNUAL FUND UPDATE



# THE CLOTHING CENTER

In just three months since opening the Ladies of Charity Clothing Center for the 2025-2026 year we have clothed 669 students. The number of clients served bespeaks the tremendous need and we are grateful to God that we can help. Thank you to the incredible volunteers who work to provide this help. We go home tired but happy. Special thanks to Beth Boemer and Joyce Grundle for their tireless work in keeping the socks and underwear bags replenished. We give 10 new pairs of socks and 7 new pairs of underwear for each client! The Bombas corporation provides socks and underwear, along with Our Lady of Lourdes Parish which holds an annual drive for us. Other donation sources include parish "Giving Tree" drives, school Lost and Found collections, and members of Ladies of Charity, neighbors, and friends. And, of course, each year the Lumen Christi Knights of Columbus provide winter jackets. We also have had an increase in donations through our LOC website.

Despite these generous resources, our stock needs frequent replenishing, given the growing number of clients served this school year. As of November 20, we clothed an increase of 168 children over one year ago. Our greatest needs now are in the areas of winter gloves, "sweats", and long-sleeved crewneck tops for both boys and girls. Of course, monetary donations are always appreciated.

We are grateful for the generosity of the many resources that contribute to our mission and the Clothing Center volunteers who continue to abide by our core mission: *To Served Rather Than Be Served with Humility, Simplicity, and Charity*. We are extremely grateful to the mothers, grandmothers, guardians, social workers, sisters, brothers, and all who come to our Clothing Center for assistance. They too are examples of *Humility, Simplicity, and Charity*. God bless each one of these courageous people, and each one of you.


### Vincentian Tidbits

#### Watershed Moments in St. Vincent de Paul's Life

While tutoring the children of a wealthy family, St. Vincent was called to the bedside of a dying estate tenant for confession and last rites. Vincent was shaken by this encounter, struck by the spiritual poverty of these country people, who were often priestless or served by ignorant clergy. He realized that bringing the Gospel to the common people was an immense need and personal mandate from God.



The second decisive event came only a few months later in the small town of Chatillon., where Vincent had requested a poor country parish so he could directly care for souls. A parishioner shared the dire straits of local family in need of food and care, which Vincent spoke of as "the duty of charity and loving one's neighbor" during his Mass homily. The immediate outpouring was overwhelming and Vincent saw an opportunity to create something new: an organized network of laypeople devoted to regular charitable service. He convened a small group of women and proposed the name "Confraternity of Charity" as a lay association of women dedicated to assisting the poor and sick. This became the first organized formal charity for laywomen, a prototype of countless charities to come. It's descendent, the International Association of Charities, including LCUSA, still exists today. "Word and deed, mission and charity", would form the focus of Vincent's vocation. What an amazing beginning to our journey of service as Ladies of Charity.
