## **DONOR HIGHLIGHTS Chapman Basketball Academy**

We received cartons and cartons of Bombas socks (10,000 pair!) since the holidays, as well as many, many donations of new and used clothing from holiday giving trees and parish clothing drives, and from individual members, who quietly drop off bags and bags of needed items. It is simply AMAZING! Here is the story of one such donor. Over the past several years we have benefitted greatly from the generosity of the Chapman Basketball Academy, which is owned and operated by Joe Chapman and his wife Carolyn Onopa Chapman. For about the past five years the Academy has hosted a Holiday Camp and clothing drive for the Ladies of Charity. Participants who make a clothing donation receive a discount on their camp registration fee. As 75-100 kids attend the camp each year, this has resulted in quite a lot of donated clothing. If the name Joe Chapman sounds familiar to you, you may recall that he played basketball at Marquette University for four years before playing professional overseas in eight different countries over a span of 11 years. Joe and Carolyn started the Academy after he retired in 2017. The Academy, based in Ozaukee County, consists of camps, leagues, training, and club teams. Though the pandemic has subsided (hopefully), the Clothing Center is still feeling its effects. Our numbers are down but not our spirit as Ladies of Charity. Faithful volunteers opened wide our Clothing Center doors for the 2022-23 school year and interacted directly with the awe-inspiring people who entered. Last year at this tme we served 933; this year we are at 712. Each Wednesday and Thursday plus one Saturday a month our doors are open to meet the clothing needs of school-age students.

In order to address the lower numbers this year, LOC volunteers called all Milwaukee Public School social workers. We thank Paulette Pecard for organizing this effort and Gail Proite Adams for hosting our brain-storming session. We have seen an increase in our numbers as a result of this outreach campaign, Yea! We will continue to identify strategies to increase our numbers and welcome your input. Please contact Gail with your ideas.

As you can imagine, our racks are kept full, thanks to generous member donations, Giving Tree donations, and Lost and Found items. One member observed how generous the boys of Milwaukee have been to this last source of clothing. The Bombas socks we have received, some 15-20,000 in the past few years, have really helped us to provide each child with seven new pairs of socks. We want to see our clothing "fly off the racks and shelves"!

The Ladies of Charity mission statement, "To Serve Rather Than Be Served" with humility, simplicity, and charity, is at the forefront of our work. How grateful we are to have this opportunity to serve such courageous people. Indeed, we thank God. Blessings to you all.



## **FATHER MIKE BERTRAM**



I recently had the opportunity to speak with Father Mike Bertram and learn about him and his life. Father Mike grew up on a farm in St. Peter, Wisconsin, in Fond du Lac County, near St. Lawrence Seminary in Mt Calvary. He and his sister were the middle children

between an older and younger brother. Father Mike attended residential St. Lawrence Seminary High School, where he entered the Capuchin Formation Program. He recalls going there as a young child with his mom, who did laundry for students. He remained in the Program through his college years at UW-Oshkosh, where he graduated with a degree in secondary education, with a major focus in social studies. He then left the Program and did "a normal life" for several years, teaching seventh and eighth grade. But, he was drawn back again to the Capuchins and along the way obtained a music degree in piano and organ from Wayne State University. He took perpetual vows as a Capuchin in 1986 and studied for the priesthood at Chicago Theological Union. He was ordained a priest in 1988.

Father Mike has been Pastor at St. Francis Parish for 19 years and also serves as Pastor of St Benedict the Moor Parish. In the past year he has become the Director of Capuchin Community Services and is now responsible for the St. Ben's Meal Program and the House of Peace. When I asked what enabled him to keep expanding his duties, he immediately responded: "It's the people I have to work with. They are great individuals, and I couldn't do it without them". As for the major influences in his life, he credited the Capuchins, but particularly the "healthy faith" of his parents, who lived their faith throughout their life and served as a powerful example for him through their actions and practice. His mom is a healthy 94-year-old woman, who recently spent Easter with him at St. Francis.

Other interesting notes—Father Mike enjoys cooking and traveling as hobbies when time allows. Tiramisu is one of his signature dishes. He also enjoys returning to his music. Fun fact—he and singer/cantor Patty De Graff used to do music for weddings in their teen years and occasionally can be heard together at St. Francis liturgies. And, did you know, the name Capuchin is derived from the Italian word "cappuccino", meaning long hood, with the Capuchins wearing the longpointed hood, distinctive among Franciscans.

Thank you, Father Mike, for allowing us a glimpse into your life and for all you do to support Ladies of Charity. We think you make a great honorary Lady of Charity!




### **Cathy Liska Reflection**

#### **Vincentian Tidbits**

As a result of the French Revolution in 1789, charitable services to the poor and vulnerable through the Confraternity of Charity were disrupted and not formally reestablished until 1840 by the Archbishop of Paris. This paved the way for women to regain a pivotal role in providing these services. One of these women was Catherine Laboure, born in Burgundy, France in 1806, the ninth of eleven children, who entered the Confraternity of the




Daughters of Charity and was known to be devout and a bit of a romantic. She reported a vision of the Blessed Mother, displaying herself inside an oval frame, standing upon a globe, wearing many rings of varied colors. On the margin of the frame the following was inscribed: "O, Mary, conceived without original sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." The frame included a circle of twelve stars, a large letter "M", and the stylized sacred hearts of both Jesus and Mary. Thus the devotion commonly known as the "Miraculous Medal" owes its origin to Sister Catherine, recipient of three separate visions from the Blessed Mother while in her Paris motherhouse. Catherine lived her remaining years as an ordinary sister, revealing just before her death that she was the woman to whom the Blessed Mother had given images for the medal. Subsequently, upon careful investigation, medals based on the instructed design were made, blessed, and within a short time were distributed; a devotion rapidly ensued. Catherine Laboure was canonized in 1947 and November 27 became her designated feast day. And so we note, members of our Vincentian family are continuing the ministry of St. Vincent de Paul to serve others with humility, simplicity, and charity. We are so thankful for the gifts and direction he has given us.
