Special heartfelt Thank You to all the members who searched for a new site and met almost weekly over the summer, systematically packed everything up and then painstakingly unpacked and set up at our new location. So many members shared their time and talents.

We are enjoying and adjusting to our new set up. The room configuration is different. There are two rooms for customers and an upstairs storage/sorting room. We could really use some additional help. I know it's busy time for all. Please consider volunteering. If you are hesitant to drive to our new location, we have members who are happy to drive you. Parking is available in the front of our

building. The city has lifted parking restrictions for us during our operating hours. We have permits you can put on your dash.

Since opening in September, our customers are finding our new location. We have served close to 400 students as of the beginning of November.

We have once again received a socks and underwear donation from Our Lady of Lourdes Parish. They hold a drive for us every summer. For a second year UWM held a clothing drive for us as students were moving out of the dorms. The Knights of Columbus at Lumen Christi purchased winter jackets for us and as in the past we were able to order jackets through their national clearing house.

We are looking forward to the many wonderful gifts from the local parish Christmas Giving Trees.

We are always looking for clothing donations. Remind your family, neighbors and friends to keep us in mind as they clean out closets or go shopping.

Thank you to all who have supported our mission to serve the poor. Our families are grateful. They are often so amazed at the quality and quantity of the clothing they receive.

HISTORICAL CORNER

Highlights of the Ladies of Charity from the 1970s

A look back in time offers us some interesting perspectives and insights. Can you imagine our organization being known by a name other than the Ladies of Charity? The appropriateness of keeping "Ladies" in our name was raised by German members. Another hot topic centered around women's rights as the United Nations designated 1975 as International Women's Year to raise awareness of the ongoing issues of gender discrimination and support for the development of women. An issue closer to home was the challenge of attracting younger women to become members, given the increasing number of

women working outside the home, a challenge we continue to face. The 1970s saw the Milwaukee Ladies of Charity contributing \$2,000 to the St. Vincent de Paul Society's Home Ownership Assistance Program to help families make a down payment and in 1977, the 20th Anniversary was celebrated with a celebratory luncheon at Cardinal Stritch College. The event was attended by 160 people, along with honored guest Archbishop William E. Cousins. - 1. I met an amazing group of women who represented a variety of cities across the USA who came to share their projects that help the less fortunate in their communities.

- The International group (AIC) is involved in water purification projects and in improving the educational opportunities for females in third world countries. I was amazed at the influence the AIC has around the world.

- 6. All the groups are dealing with recruitment issues, especially with younger women. Being flexible is a key to maintaining current members and recruiting new members.
- 7. Finally, I came away so renewed and so proud to be a Lady of Charity.




CATHY LISKA REFLECTION

Vincentian Tidbits

The following comments are drawn from the writings of the Spanish priest Father Jaime Corera Andia, who contributed significantly to the study of St. Vincent de Paul. Commentary highlights include:


- St. Vincent's spirituality is marked by his vision of community service to those commonly thought of as marginalized (victims of war and persecution, immigrants and refugees, the sick, mentally ill, abandoned children, among others).
- His vision broke with prominent traditional clerical hierarchies, becoming a more missionary and outward-facing Church.
- Most of his institutions were secular, implying a break from the alliance between
 the throne and the altar. His view encompassed the Church not as the church of
 kings and wealthy people but the
- Church of the poor.
- St Vincent was motivated and directed by a radical purpose "to respond to the designs of God and to imitate the earthly life of Jesus Christ"

The Vincentian family will gather in Rome from November 14-17. Aren't you proud and thankful to share in the tradition St. Vincent left us!
